Reading of the week: Genesis 1:1-13 and 2:1-3 (NIV) In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth. ² Now the earth was formless and empty, darkness was over the surface of the deep, and the Spirit of God was hovering over the waters.³ And God said, "Let there be light," and there was light. ⁴ God saw that the light was good, and he separated the light from the darkness. ⁵ God called the light "day," and the darkness he called "night." And there was evening, and there was morning—the first day.⁶ And God said, "Let there be a vault between the waters to separate water from water." ⁷ So God made the vault and separated the water under the vault from the water above it. And it was so. ⁸ God called the vault "sky." And there was evening, and there was morning—the second day.⁹ And God said, "Let the water under the sky be gathered to one place, and let dry ground appear." And it was so.

¹⁰God called the dry ground "land," and the gathered waters he called "seas." Then God blessed the seventh day and made it holy, because on it he rested from all the work of creating that he had done.

Thought for the day: Lis Ward

In the beginning God created— How did he create? Through the power of his Word he spoke all things into being. Jesus, the Word of God, is described as being present (see John 1) and the Spirit of God hovers is hovering over the waters, all three persons of the Trinity are involved.

What does God create? God creation is full of wonderful things. When we see an amazing view, a magnificent sunset, a beautiful flower, a new born baby, we catch a glimpse of the wonders that God has made. At the end of it all he creates a day of rest, a time to stand and reflect and enjoy.

Why does God create his world? For pleasure, for enjoyment, to share what he has made with humanity. We are designed to be in relationship with God and can choose to recognise how he is revealed through his creation and through Jesus his Son, the way to the Father. The challenge for us is what to do with our responsibility to care for all that God has made.
