Today's reading: Philippians 4:10-20

¹⁰ I rejoiced greatly in the Lord that at last you renewed your concern for me. Indeed, you were concerned, but you had no opportunity to show it.

¹¹ I am not saying this because I am in need, for I have learned to be content whatever the circumstances. ¹² I know what it is to be in need, and I know what it is to have plenty. I have learned the secret of being content in any and every situation, whether well fed or hungry, whether living in plenty or in want. ¹³ I can do all this through him who gives me strength. ¹⁴ Yet it was good of you to share in my troubles. ¹⁵ Moreover, as you Philippians know, in the early days of your acquaintance with the gospel, when I set out from Macedonia, not one church shared with me in the matter of giving and receiving, except you only; ¹⁶ for even when I was in Thessalonica, you sent me aid more than once when I was in need. ¹⁷ Not that I desire your gifts; what I desire is that more be credited to your account.

¹⁸ I have received full payment and have more than enough. I am amply supplied, now that I have received from Epaphroditus the gifts you sent. They are a fragrant offering, an acceptable sacrifice, pleasing to God. ¹⁹ And my God will meet all your needs according to the riches of his glory in Christ

Thought for the day: Ian Ward

Paul is writing to his friends in Philippi to give thanks and encourage a suffering community of believers. In our reading he is thanking his friends for their generous giving and passing on a secret. His secret is that the key to life is learning to be content in all circumstances. He tells them that he has learned contentment in Jesus in everything he has experienced, the good and the bad, the high and the lows. I have seen this in my own life, when I have learned to be content in where God has placed me and what is going on around me, it is then that God turns the page and shows me the next chapter of my story. So Paul is able to confidently proclaim to his friends that "God will meet all your needs according to the riches of his glory in Christ Jesus" verse 19.
