Reading: Numbers 13:1-3, 26-31 and 14:5-9


The LORD said to Moses, ²“Send some men to explore the land of Canaan, which I am giving to the Israelites. From each ancestral tribe send one of its leaders.”
³So at the LORD’s command Moses sent them out from the Desert of Paran. All of them were leaders of the Israelites.²⁶They came back to Moses and Aaron and the whole Israelite community at Kadesh in the Desert of Paran. There they reported to them and to the whole assembly and showed them the fruit of the land. ²⁷They gave Moses this account: “We went into the land to which you sent us, and it does flow with milk and honey! Here is its fruit. ²⁸But the people who live there are powerful, and the cities are fortified and very large. We even saw descendants of Anak there. ²⁹The Amalekites live in the Negev; the Hittites, Jebusites and Amorites live in the hill country; and the Canaanites live near the sea and along the Jordan.” ³⁰Then Caleb silenced the people before Moses and said, “We should go up and take possession of the land, for we can certainly do it.” ³¹But the men who had gone up with him said, “We can’t attack those people; they are stronger than we are.

entire Israelite assembly, “The land we passed through and explored is exceedingly good. ⁸If the LORD is pleased with us, he will lead us into that land, a land flowing with milk and honey, and will give it to us. ⁹Only do not rebel against the LORD. This last year has been tough with lots of tears and heartache but those of us who know Christ have him as our anchor. It is His faith and love that filled our hurting hearts, His hope that sustained us through the hard times. Four leadership principles that have encouraged us are:

1. R = Remain Relational. This has been hard with difficult relationships but God has reminded us to value people more than the problem.
2. A = Act like yourself. We need to be who God has created us to be not shaped by others or our fears of what they might think
3. R = Return to Joy. This means accepting all our emotions and the suffering we may go through but consciously choosing joy despite life challenges. We can be intentional about this.
4. E = Endure Hardship Well We grow as disciples as we endure. One of our priorities is to End Bible Poverty. YWAM has been working with others to enable all to have access to the Bible in their own language’ giving people tools they need to endure hardship well.

In this time of sudden disruption God calls us all to be children of the light, RARE Christians and RARE Leaders. Thank you for praying for us.
