Reading of the week: Luke 10:25-37

<sup>25</sup>On one occasion an expert in the law stood up to test lesus. "Teacher." he asked. "what must I do to inherit eternal life?" 26 "What is written in the Law?" he replied. "How do you read it?"<sup>27</sup>He answered, "'Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength and with all your mind'; and, 'Love your neighbour as yourself."28 "You have answered correctly," lesus replied, "Do this and you will live," <sup>29</sup> But he wanted to justify himself, so he asked lesus, "And who is my neighbor?"30 In reply lesus said: "A man was going down from Jerusalem to Jericho, when he was attacked by robbers. They stripped him of his clothes, beat him and went away, leaving him half dead. 31 A priest happened to be going down the same road, and when he saw the man, he passed by on the other side. 32 So too, a Levite, when he came to the place and saw him, passed by on the other side. 33 But a Samaritan, as he travelled, came where the man was; and when he saw him, he took pity on him. 34 He went to him and bandaged his wounds, pouring on oil and wine. Then he put the man on his own donkey, brought him to an inn and took care of him. 35 The next day he took out two denari and gave them to the innkeeper. 'Look after him,' he said, 'and when I return, I will reimburse you for any extra expense you may have.' 36 "Which of these three do you think was a neighbour to the man who fell into the hands of robbers?"37 The expert in the law replied, "The one who had mercy on him." Jesus told him, "Go and do likewise."

Thought for the day: Ian Ward: Parable of the Good Samaritan.: Probably the best-known parable. It seems to answer the question "who is our neighbour?" But it is actually part of an answer to the greater question "what must I do to inherit eternal life?"

The questioner answers his own question. "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength and with all your mind": and. "Love your neighbour as yourself". Eternal life is about both loving God, upwards and also loving others, outwards.

Both the Priest and the Levite in the story believe they have got the loving God bit sorted, but they fail miserably at loving others. The Samaritan teaches how to love others: 1) See the need 2) Let the need to touch us 3) Take risks to meet the need 4) Be prepared to pay the cost
