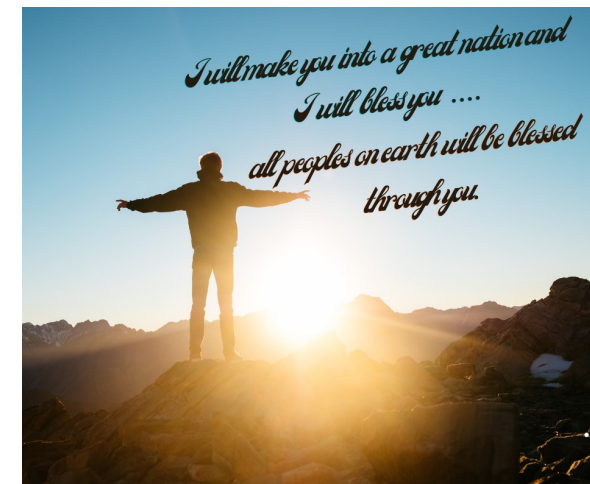

Genesis 12:1-9 The Call of Abraham

Reading: Genesis 12:1-9 ¹The LORD had said to Abram, "Go from your country, your people and your father's household to the land I will show you. ²"I will make you into a great nation, and I will bless you; I will make your name great, and you will be a blessing. ³I will bless those who bless you, and whoever curses you I will curse; and all peoples on earth will be blessed through you." ⁴So Abram went, as the LORD had told him; and Lot went with him. Abram was seventy-five years old when he set out from Harran. ⁵He took his wife Sarai, his nephew Lot, all the possessions they had accumulated and the people they had acquired in Harran, and they set out for the land of Canaan, and they arrived there. ⁶Abram travelled through the land as far as the site of the great tree of Moreh at Shechem. At that time the Canaanites were in the land. ⁷The LORD appeared to Abram and said, "To your offspring I will give this land." So he built an altar there to the LORD, who had appeared to him. ⁸From there he went on toward the hills east of Bethel and pitched his tent, with Bethel on the west and Ai on the east. There he built an altar to the LORD and called on the name of the LORD. ⁹Then Abram set out and continued toward the Negev.

Thought for the day Ian Ward

Looking at the life of Abraham we in the earliest moments of recorded history around 2150 BC. Genesis as we have it today was probably not written down until 640 BC. We need to take special care as we dig into the story of Abraham.

God calls Abraham to leave everything he knows and move into the unknown. Not just geographically but socially, ethically and in his relationship to the Creator. He left behind the worship of created things, sun, moon, trees and began a relationship with the creator.

With the Call comes a Covenant. God promises to transform Abraham from being the end of the line to being the Father of a nation, from itinerant to blessing, not just for his family but all nations.

God is still calling us today. The journey of 1000 miles begins with a single step.
